# What is an Accident 01 and Emergency (A&E) Department?

A&E and assessment areas are open 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, 365 days a year and provide care and treatment for adults and children who have:

- Life threatening illness or injury
- Emergency medical conditions
- Been in road traffic accidents
- Had an accident that requires medical attention

Emergency Department's and Assessment Areas

What does a patient attending A&E / assessment area need with them?

- Any medication they usually take
- Details of their next of kin
- Care records if they can not share their needs with us
- Enough clothing and hygiene supplies for 24 hours, just in case they are admitted

## What happens when you Attend an A&E / Assessment 02 Area

When someone arrived in A&E / assessment area will be assessed by nurse or doctor generally before further actions are taken. This is called triage. Triage ensures people with the most serious conditions are seen first.

If the nurse or doctor feels the situation is not a serious accident or emergency the patient may be sent to a nearby urgent care centre, minor injuries unit or referred to a GP on site. This means that patients are seen by the most appropriate medical practitioner, in the most appropriate setting and also reduces waiting times.

### The patients journey

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Patients who attend A&E or an assessment area may require tests to make an informed assessment these may include:

- X-Rays
- Blood tests
- ECG
- Urine test

Once a patient has been seen by doctor or nurse practitioner they may be treated and

- Sent home
- · Admitted to ward
- Sent to an assessment area for further tests or an overnight stay.

Patients who attend A&E or assessment areas are not always admitted to hospital.
